Bull Lake FD adds pair of fire engines to its fleet

The Bull Lake Fire Disrict recently upgraded its fleet to include two Type 2 fire engines. One of the acquisitions is stationed at Angel Island and replaces a 42-year-old engine. The other will be assigned to the new Majestic View station.

"Through our affiliation with a neighboring fire department, we were able to negotiate the purchase of two Type 2 engines made available from the California State Emergency Management Agency's Surplus Equipment Program," the

fire district's Gerald Wallace said. "Fire district personnel drove to Sacramento to facilitate delivery of the fully-equipped units."

After the fire engines arrived in Montana back in October, they underwent comprehensive service testing, modification and adjustments. They were put into service on Dec. 2.

Wallace said the Bull Lake Fire Auxiliary's purchase of the Angel Island engine was made possible through proceeds raised from three events - the fun day and auction held at the Bull Lake

Rod and Gun Club, the baked goods booth at Nordicfest and a sizeable garage sale held over the summer.

The Majestic View fire engine was purchased by Majestic View Ministries in support of the fire district and is staffed by personnel in that vicinity, Wallace said.

"The addition of these engines assures the reliability our firefighters expect as they strive to improve fire protection to our Bull Lake community," fire chief Clyde Miller said while expressing appreciation to the auxiliary and board.

Remembering Mel Syth

1923 - 2010

Melvin V Syth, 87, died peacefully at home in Helena on August 15, 2010. He was born February 9, 1923 in Greenwood, Wisconsin, the son of William and Helen (Stoneberg) Syth. The family moved to Girard, Montana when he was a toddler and then moved to Heron, MT in 1938 where he graduated eighth grade, going on to High School at Noxon, Montana.

He attended Northwestern Business College for about six months when he was called for induction by the Draft Board. Rather than going into the Army, Mel thought the Navy would be more to his liking, so he enlisted on May 15, 1943. He had boot training at USNTS Farragut, ID from there to NT school (R) U of Idaho next to Communication School PhibTrac. (Pac), then to USS Alabama (BB-60), and was honorably

discharged from USNB, Bremmerton, WA on March 8, 1946.

He married a wonderful lady (Anita) in July 1947 and became an instant father to three children from Anita's marriage to Jessie Stevens (deceased). They had three more children; all have grown up with families of their own.

He worked four years with Flathead County, primarily on roads and bridges. He spent eight years with the Montana Highway Department in Kalispell and Libby and then worked for the City of Libby until his retirement in 1979.

After retirement, Meland Anita moved to Bull Lake where they were charter members of the Bull Lake Ambulance Service. Mel also served thirteen of his retirement years on the volunteer fire department. His retirement years allowed him to enjoy many community activities, travel around the United States to visit relatives or see new sites, and to enjoy the outdoors.

He is survived by children, Charles Stevens (Ruth) Haydon Lake ID., Mary Thomas (Dave) Helena MT, and Gregory Syth (Tina) Cheybogan MI, siblings: Alta

Esler, Missouri, Gerald (DeEtte) Syth, Montana, Verlyn (JoNell) Syth, Idaho, and Billy (Grace) Syth, Idaho. Several grandchildren, great grand children, and great-great grand children plus numerous cousins, nieces & nephews also survive.

He was preceded in death by his parents, William and Helen Syth; wife, Anita Syth, sons, Larry Syth and Kenneth Stevens. Daughter, Doris Batten, siblings: William and Wayne (twins), Ted Syth, Grace LaMont, Bernard Syth, Alma Rowe, Hugh Syth, Kenneth Syth, May Allen, Marjorie Zuhnter, Lyle Syth, Esther Mischel, and Arthur Syth.

We also requested a grant from Stimson Lumber Company several months ago and we have had NO response at all. This seems to be a pattern with Stimson.

A donation request was also made to Genesis Mining Corp. They are looking positively at making a donation to Bull Lake Fire Dept.
